The New Jersey Water Supply Authority to Host Public Information Session to Educate Stakeholders about the Project, Schedule and More

CLINTON, NJ – The New Jersey Water Supply Authority will hold an information session to inform public about the latest progress on the Round Valley Reservoir Structures Refurbishment and Resource Preservation Project. Attendees will be able to ask questions and provide their comments directly to project representatives. Representatives from The New Jersey Water Supply Authority and Engineer of Record for the project, Schnabel Engineering, will make remarks during a brief presentation at 7:00 p.m. There will be a question and answer session after the presentation.

The Authority is making improvements to the reservoir over the next few years to extend its operating life as a critical source of drinking water and increase its durability for years to come.
